About ten years ago,
Father Peter

Anglaare traveled from his home in the Upper West Region of Ghana to serve parishes in the Southern Tier of New York



State. Since his arrival in the US, Fr. Peter's ministry has extended far beyond the parishes he has served in Steuben County towns of Bath and Hornell. His gentle, effective ministry has made an impact on entire communities. Although now a US citizen, Fr. Peter continues to return home to the Village of Ko, a community so remote and impoverished that most of its residents have no electricity, running water or public sanitation.

Throughout the years, Father Peter has donated a substantial portion of his priestly income to assist African girls from his village and beyond to get the education that their parents cannot afford. Education is the primary way out of poverty for girls in Ghana who may otherwise be "married off" at a young age by their impoverished parents.
